

Program: Kitchener Stitch

This stitch technique is commonly used to close up the toes of socks that are knit top down. It's invisible and leaves no seam lines. But it can also be used in many other ways. You can use it to graft two ends of a scarf together to make a cozy cowl.

Homework:

Cast on 18 stitches in a yarn of your choice. Knit about 2" in stockinette stitch. Leaving work on the needle, cast on another piece just the same as the first and work 2" again. Cut yarn, leaving a long tail - about 32". Leave both pieces on separate needles. Alternatively, you may cast on 36 stitches and join to work in the round. Work for 2", leaving your work on the needles. Leave a 32" tail. You may use dpns, or two circular needles for this.

Material and Supplies:

Bring a darning needle for the grafting!
